Installation of high voltage direct current cables for the Viking Link Interconnector project between proposed landfall at Boygrift in East Lindsey to a proposed converter station at North Ing Drove; installation of alternative current cables from the converter station to the existing Bicker Fen 400 KV substation; as well as permanent access road to converter station, temporary facilities required during construction such as compounds and works areas - amended plans & additional information received Ing Drove, Donington

Thank you for consulting us on the amended plans for the above project on 28 November 2017.

I can advise that we have no comments to make in respect of the amended plans and supplementary environmental information. However, we note on page 4 of the applicant's covering letter (under the heading of Third Party Crossing Agreements) that it states they "do not consider the agreement to which the EA seek agreement material to the planning determination process, and indeed the EA note in their initial draft of the agreement that the relevant legislation comprises the Water Resources Act 1991 the Environmental Permitting Regulations 2016 and the Land Drainage Act 1991". The clause from which these words have been taken states:-

'This Agreement is made without prejudice to any consent that may be required under the Water Resources Act 1991, the Land Drainage Act 1991, the Environmental Permitting Regulations 2016 or any other relevant legislation.'

and makes it clear that, whatever may be in the agreement, the developer still has to apply for any relevant consents for their works.

Our objection is made in our role as a statutory consultee under the Development

Management Procedure Order 2015, Schedule 4, parts (t) and (zc). In our opinion, the works proposed to be undertaken within 20 metres of main rivers have the potential to increase the frequency and impact of flooding as outlined in our letter of 19 October, which is material to the planning determination process. The draft agreement addresses our concerns about the effect the proposed works may have on the defences adjacent to the main rivers and on the sea defence and, if concluded satisfactorily, will enable us to remove our objection.
