A temporary repair has been made but with further growth the wall will collapse and will need completely rebuilding.	N/A
Yew	2	Trimming of small overhanging branches (1-2m in length) adjacent to the building of adjacent property (8 Church Street)	To prevent the yew tree causing damage to the neighbouring building.	N/A
